

MUSIC FOR CHILDREN UGANDA - SIX MONTHS PLAN – January – June 2022

Hi there,

We hope everything is going on well over there in the Netherlands. We are all fine and we would like to thank you so much for the support you have given to us and to the children in Uganda. We are so happy that we will go on working with you in the coming year. This is what we are planning for the first half six months of 2022.

New classes of young children.

First we are going to have a new class of students both at Wipe a Tear (in Kampala) and Khule Africa (in Ggaba). These classes consist of very young kids as you can see in the pictures. We are not dropping the class that we have been working with, but since the schools reopened after almost two years and they have joined their secondary level their time for music classes is going to be very limited. We will mainly teach them in the weekends.

The young kids at Wipe a Tear take their school class right there at the home they live in. The children in Khule Africa go to different schools in Ggaba. The kids at Wipe a Tear will be having music theory classes every Tuesday and Friday and they will practice playing the instruments every day in the evening.

Every end of the month they will be having a music test exam, just like the schools take exams every month for other classes. At the end of these six months we hope to start a music exchange program in different schools in the neighborhood to give these little kids exposure.

Dance classes at Wipe a Tear.

About the dance classes at Wipe a Tear: we first want to thank you so much for the music box and the drums! Having those really helps a lot in improving the dance lessons. Although now there is some more work for us to do. We have to teach these kids how to play these drum so that we don't have to hire people to help us drum whenever we want to use them. Therefore we kindly ask you if it would be possible to hire another teacher to help us teach the children how to play the drums. That would really help and would enable the kids to perform all kinds of cultural dances. We will be very happy to hear from you about this.

So in the first half of 2022 the above is what we have planned to focus on and put all our efforts on. We believe it will work out as we have planned with your great support.

We want to say thanks again for trusting and believing in us. We are so happy with your work and that you allow us to be part of your vision of music for children. We hope to have the best results possible out of our efforts and your support.
